MESSAGE FROM OUR SAFETY OFFICER

Engine Checks:

I don't WOBBLE any more.

We used to be told that the daily engine check should cover WOBBLE: Water filter, Oil, Belt tension, Bilge (for leaks), Levels (coolant), and Electrics plus Exhaust. Then they added D for diesel (make sure you have enough fuel).

Now more of us are making it I-WOBBLED. We start by isolating the engine - turning off the batteries, so no-one on deck can accidentally start the engine while our hands are in there. Remember to turn the switches back when you're finished, and maybe check the battery meter too.


DINGHY RACING

Having travelled together, the crew met Pierce and Dan in Brest on Silver Wind, which they'd just fully provisioned. After a whistle-wetter, we headed out for dinner, noting the insane spring tidal range on our way back. On Sunday, we sailed, then motored up the Aulne river, passing the spooky and malevolent-looking decommissioned French navy ship graveyard. We docked overnight in Chateaulin where, in the absence of a marina, some enterprising crew members made a beeline for the Hôtel de Ville to avail themselves of the mayor's personal bathroom.

On our way back downriver, the lock wasn't working so we had to wait for it to be fixed. But, when the going gets tough, the tough have petit déjeuner – we'd already relieved the local boulangerie of most of its inventory of croissants and patisserie. Then overnight in Camaret before striking out for Cornwall on Tuesday, with the UK weather looking much more promising than Brittany's. A 25-hour crossing, one of the week's highlights – on a single tack – and we were in Falmouth. Leisurely sailing after that, anchoring in the Helford River one night to experience the charms of rural Cornwall. Some great food in Cornwall (actually better than in France – sacré bleu!), a very interesting visit to Pendennis Castle and a bit of a snoop at Queen drummer, Roger Taylor's impressive gaff.

Overall verdict – a great skipper, who put so much effort in but made it all appear effortless, including impromptu guitalele recitals, and a willing and lively crew, all of which made for an outstanding week's cruising.
